- **Course title: Essentials English 12, or Essentials English Skills**

- **Course Description:** The class is for students on an IEP with goals in reading &/or writing. Most assignments will be completed in the class time. Students will be asked to independently read one novel a quarter and write a paper. In class, we will do a variety of activities, which may include reading The Blade, class novels, and an independent novel. Seniors will also prepare a working resume and practice their job interview skills. We will cover elements of literature and practice writing skills. Students will participate in a combination of reading aloud, silent reading, listening to peers read, and listening to staff read aloud. Current studies suggest this is an effective method to improve students' reading abilities. I am sensitive to the needs of students who can not read.
- **Textbooks and Materials:** Texts and reading materials will be determined throughout the year based on availability and student ability. IEP goals will play a factor in curriculum content. Students may be asked to purchase a novel. Students do need to bring loose-leaf paper, 1- plain pocket folders, pens & pencils, 1 box of tissues. Students also need their own flash drive which may be used for their other classes as well.

Grading: Grading is based on class participation, completion of assignments, and individual student abilities. Please see page 43 of the student handbook for the new grading scale.
