Course Topics: French II continues the learning of the language with emphasis on more complex structures and vocabulary .
Students will increase their conversation ability.

Materials:

1. Allez, viens! Level 2 textbook – Must be covered with book Cover – Bring everyday unless otherwise instructed
2. Allez, viens! Level 2 Workbook – billed with fees
3. Binder of 1” with pockets and notebook paper
4. Pens and pencils daily, markers for certain projects

Grading: 1. A point system will be used. All work will be given a point value. This includes homework, quizzes, tests, oral work and projects. All make-up tests will be scheduled outside of class, within two days of the absence, according to the student handbook. All evaluations will be posted on the eSIS Parent Assistance Module. Quiz evaluations will be approximately weekly with chapter tests monthly. Daily oral participation is recorded for a quarterly grade.

Grading Cont. 2. Routine homework will be from the workbook or textbook in order to practice classroom material. These assignments will be graded for completion and effort, and will be recorded daily for credit. Certain assignments will be collected periodically. These daily assignments will not be accepted late.

Grading cont. 3. Paragraphs or projects will be graded for content and grammar according to a rubric. The use of online translators or devices is prohibited and

considered cheating. Long term assignments will be accepted late with an appropriate point deduction.
